

# January 5, 2025 Feast of the Epiphany

### To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

COME LET US ADORE HIM: A blessed feast of the Epiphany to each of you! What wondrous faith that the Magi possessed. They travelled far, following a star, moved by the hope that the child they sought would forever change the world. They found him – the infant Christ – and they adored his divine majesty. Earthy kings humbled themselves before the King of Kings. What a beautiful act of faith! In this New Year, will you and I too lay aside our pride and humble ourselves before the Lord and God, Jesus Christ? I hope and pray that we do. The things of this world, even the best and the purest and the most wonderful, are all passing away. Jesus Christ endures. He alone is our refuge and our treasure. Like the Magi, we too can go to him. Unlike the Magi, we need not travel far. How blessed we are that the only Perpetual Adoration Chapel in our entire diocese is found within our very own boundaries! Jesus is with us in such an amazing and accessible way! Think of it: the same infant Savior that lay in the manger at Bethlehem is now is found on the altar of Adoration at 24th and Sassafras. What a gift he offers us: the gift of his very self! In return, he does not ask us for gold, frankincense or myrrh. He asks for our presence. He asks for our hearts. He asks for our love. Please consider becoming a committed adorer this year. Ask those who already spend an hour before the Eucharistic Lord each week – it's transforming. Come, let us adore him!

In her wisdom, the Church is right to make the retreat a requirement. We cannot give what we do not have, and the purpose of retreat time is to open a priest's heart to a new outpouring of God's goodness and grace. Throughout the years, I've made my retreat in different locations and using different formats. I've been to large, preached retreats in which many priests are together. For the past several years, though, I've been going alone to Hope House. Why a solitary retreat? I love the solitude and the silence. I appreciate not having to adhere to a set schedule. Hope House provides delicious meals, intimate surroundings, and beautiful religious art. The Hope House chapel is a place of particular beauty, and I spend a lot of time with our Lord there, sitting before the Blessed Sacrament, and admittedly, wrapped in a blanket. I will offer Mass each day, I typically take a long walk, and in the evening, I enjoy spending time before the fireplace. Please be assured that I will remember you often in my prayer. I ask that you lift me up in your prayers, as well. Fr. Chris Singer will be covering our parish Masses from Tuesday through Friday. God bless you all and thank you for your prayers.

**WELCOME DEB:** Finally, I want to welcome Deb Tarasovitch to our parish staff! Deb will be giving us 10 hours per week for some much-needed assistance in the office. Our staff works incredibly hard, there is a lot of business to take care of, but even more importantly, our office is a place where folks are welcomed and prayed with and loved. 

## St. Joseph OVERFLOW SHELTER

St. Joseph/ Bread of Life will be hosting "Our Neighbor's Place" Overflow Shelter from Wednesday, January 1<sup>st</sup> at 7 PM thru Wednesday, January 8<sup>th</sup> at 7 AM. The shelter is located at the old Community Corrections Center 450 E. 16th St, Erie, PA 16503.

We need male and female volunteers for the following shifts: 7PM-11PM (a good shift for teen service hours), 11PM-3AM, and 3 AM-7AM. The overnight hours are obviously the most difficult to fill.

Erie United Methodist Association will provide paid volunteers for each shift, however extra help is needed and appreciated.

We need volunteers to make 60 bagged meals for each night by 6 PM starting on January 1st. Meals can be prepared at St. Joe's kitchen. Shawn Tubbs will pick the meals up every night to take them to the shelter. We do not need a bagged meal for Saturday, January 4th.

Finally, cash /check donations, clothing, and toiletries can be dropped off M-F at St. Joe's office between 8 AM and 4 PM or can be left in front of the office door before or after Mass on Sunday or Christmas day.



#### DECREE

# OUTLINING THE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE RECEPTION OF INDULGENCES RELATED TO THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025 IN THE DIOCESE OF ERIE

A Plenary Indulgence may be received in the Diocese of Erie by doing the following during the period from December 29, 2024 through December 31, 2025:

At least once during the Holy Year:

- Receive sacramental confession and absolution
- Receive Holy Communion

And, while striving to be free from attachment to sin, carry out any of the following:

Make a pilgrimage visit, whether individually or as a group (family, parish, co-workers, etc.), to either St. Peter Cathedral, Erie, or St. Leo Magnus Church, Ridgway, and while visiting those sites take time for prayer specifically for the intentions of the Holy Father.

Those who are truly repentant of sin, but who cannot participate in diocesan pilgrimages, can receive the Jubilee Indulgence by prayerfully reciting the Our Father and any approved version of the Profession of Faith (Creed), and also praying for the intentions of the Holy Father. Those who are homebound due to age, illness, imprisonment, etc., may also offer up their suffering as a prayer for others and/or for the poor souls in purgatory.

Visit for an appropriate amount of time family members, neighbors or friends who are in need (such as the sick, lonely elderly people, the disabled, prisoners, etc.) This visit is to be made with a vibrant awareness of Christ's presence in these persons in need.

Carry out personal acts of penance for an entire day (particularly Fridays), such as:

- Abstain from eating meat
- Abstain from futile distractions (such as entertainment, social media, etc.)
- Abstain from unnecessary consumption of food or drink (fasting)

Carry out significant acts of charity such as:

- Contribute to the poor
- Support the homeless, the orphan, the migrant or alien, etc.
- Contribute a significant amount of one's free time to worthy volunteer activities in support of human life and dignity

During the Jubilee Year an individual may receive one Plenary Indulgence per day, and may apply that indulgence to themselves or to a deceased person.



## **Deacon Dabblings**


Today we celebrate the feast of the epiphany. And of course, when we think of the feast of the epiphany what image comes to mind? For most it is the three Magi who came from a faraway land and brought some very significant gifts to the Christ Child. Now, we know that the Magi didn't just walk aimlessly looking for the Christ Child. They were guided. Tradition says that the Star of Bethlehem guided them and that's how they found the Christ Child.

But, what about the fourth Magi? You know, there is a fourth Magi? Who is this fourth Magi and how does he or she find Christ? We, all of us here, are the fourth Magi and through our baptism we are challenged to follow a road that leads to Christ. So, what do we use to find our way to Christ? Everyone needs something or someone to guide him or her through life. If you have nothing to give direction and stability to your life, you can become confused, running around, not knowing where you're going or where you're heading. And sad to say, that's the way that a lot of people live life today. If you ask some people what guides them through life, what helps them determine right from wrong, good from evil, virtue from vice, they'll say, they don't know. It's just what feels good or what seems right, but they have nothing objective, nothing specific. Other people have things that drive them but what they choose is transitory. Their lives may be governed by drugs or alcohol or gambling. Where does that lead that person? Where does that take them? Down a dead-end road!

The only road that has a good ending is the one that leads to Christ. And the only way to walk that road is to follow Christ who is the light of the world, who is a light that shines in the darkness, beckoning us, calling us, inviting us to follow. We who walk that road will find our lives fulfilled because we will see Christ in others. We who walk that road will be comforted in our sufferings because we'll feel the presence of Christ with us. We who walk that road will be compassionate and forgiving of others because we know that's the way that God is toward us.

The point is that those who follow Christ have a framework to how they should live. They have a structure as to how they should behave and how to treat one another. We don't have to have some miraculous vision to do this. But we do need to follow a star. We do need to look beyond the secular horizons of this world. We do need to look up to the heavens and see that there is a light there to guide you, a light to draw you, a light that invites you on a journey through life. Life is a journey that has twists and turns and sometimes seems to go uphill more than it does down but a journey that promises to end up in a place that is filled with nothing less than the presence of God himself. I hope that each of us here will be able to see ourselves as the fourth Magi and that we will be faithful followers of Christ.
