A CULTURE OF PRAYER II: I hope you were able to pick up a copy of Bishop Barron's Introduction to Prayer at church last weekend. If not, and you would like one, give the office a call and we can arrange to get one into your hands. I have been reading the book, too, because there is always so much more to learn and to experience when it comes to prayer. Most essentially, we simply must discipline ourselves and ensure that every single day we spend some dedicated time with God. The gospels so beautifully demonstrate that our Lord himself was a man who prayed constantly. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he prayed so intensely that he shed drops of blood (Luke 22:44)! You and I our particularly blessed in our partnered parishes to have ready access to the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at St. Joseph Church. If you have never been in to see the beauty of that place, please stop by. Our Lord is exposed there in the Blessed Sacrament, 24/7. People tell me all the time that the moments they spend in that chapel with Jesus are the best moments of their week. We are always in need of "Committed Adorers." 

SHROUD OF TURIN: A couple of weeks ago, in my Sunday homily, I talked about the Eucharistic miracle of Lanciano, and how the blood type from that miracle matched the blood type from the Shroud of Turin – AB+. I was particularly excited, therefore, to see that recent x-ray studies of the Shroud have confirmed the linen to be 2,000 years old. A while back, carbon dating examinations indicated that the shroud could only be traced back to the medieval period, but defenders of the shroud argued that the carbon dating findings were skewed because of the Shroud's material composition. This new x-ray study appears to again give credence to the authenticity of this burial cloth. Our Faith certainly doesn't rest upon the veracity of artifacts and relics, but it is pretty darned cool when they indeed point back to Christ himself. I encourage you to learn more about the Shroud and about the Eucharistic miracles that have occurred throughout our Catholic Church's history. It is fascinating!




A Family Perspective






