To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

HOLY SEASON OF LENT: The time of turning away from sin and believing in the Gospel arrives again on Wednesday. Noah spent 40 nights in the ark, the Israelites spent 40 years in the desert, and Christ spent 40 days in the desert. Now you and I are called – during the 40 days of Lent - to prepare our hearts for Easter. Through the time-honored traditions of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we are given this sacred season to enter deeply into the mystery of our salvation in Christ. Please, use these days wisely and well. Do penance, pray fervently, and seek opportunities to bless the poor. Make a firm commitment. As a parish family, there are several opportunities for us to come together in worship and prayer:

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL: One way of combining Lenten penance with Lenten almsgiving is to make a pledge to our diocesan CSA. As your pastor, I am donating equally to both of our appeals (Sacred Heart/St. Paul and St. Joseph BOL). I am only asking you to support the parish you "officially" belong to. Please remember that we must pay our assessments (\$67,632 for Sacred Heart/St. Paul and \$56,147 for St. Joseph Bread of Life) to the diocese no matter how much money we bring in. These funds, you recall, are used to support all the varying ministries that the Catholic Church in our area provides. Above and beyond our assessments, we can use the funds that you donate to support our <u>2025 CSA project – upgrade of the sound systems at all three churches</u>. Thank you so very, very much for your generosity and your support of our parish family!
