Deacon Dabblings

LENT: IT'S THE MOST WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR!

Every year, as Lent approaches, most of us begin to think about what we are going to do to make this season meaningful. Many lean toward giving something up for Lent, the most popular being giving up sweets, and certain recreational activities, and. This allows us to make a sacrifice and at the same time drop an inch or two off the waistline. I have been guilty of this for many years only to eat three pounds of chocolate on Easter Sunday and regain the weight that was lost. Lately though, rather than giving something up, I have been leaning toward doing something(s) positive to grow Spiritually during this season. I came across an article that used inanimate objects to describe what would be the best thing to do to improve their existence during Lent. See what you think.

If we were knives, Lent would be a time to sharpen our cutting edges. If we were cars, Lent would be a time for an oil change and a tune-up. If we were swimming pools, Lent would be a time to filter the dirt out of our water. If we were gardens, Lent would be a time to fertilize our soil and dig out our weeds. If we were carpets, Lent would be a time to get power cleaned. If we were VCRs, Lent would be a time to clean our heads and adjust our tracking. If we were computers, Lent would be a time to overhaul our disk drive. If we were highways, Lent would be a time to repair our cracks and fill our chuckholes. If we were TV sets, Lent would be a time to adjust our focus and our fine-tuning. If we were silverware, Lent would be a time to clean away our tarnish. If we were batteries, Lent would be a time to be recharged. If we were seeds, Lent would be a time to germinate and reach for the sun.¹

But we are none of these things: We are people who sometimes do wrong things, and we must atone for them. We are people who sometimes get spiritually lazy; we need to get back into shape. We are people who sometimes become selfish; we need to abandon our nearsightedness and begin thinking of others again. We are people who sometimes lose sight of our purpose on earth and the wonderful potential within us so, we need to regain our vision. And because we are also people who sometimes tend to put those things off, we need to make time for important things in our life. So, we have Lent, a holy time of reflection, prayer, and sacrifice.

This is the First Sunday of Lent and Holy Week seems so far off. But is it really? We must prepare ourselves to live our lives in the way Christ demands. We must start today. Jesus didn't just go out and square off against the devil. No, he prepared himself through isolation and prayer. And we need to do the same thing because just like Jesus, temptation will constantly come into our life, and we have to be prepared to fend it off. So, whether your Lenten promise is to give up sweets, or to stop poking the cat with a fork, everyday make time for prayer, and quiet reflection, reach out to those in need, mend any quarrels with others, and make this Lenten season the most wonderful time of the year!
