

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

Kinship Korner May God Lead Us Forward



Due to a cessation of funding for refugee resettlement, Catholic Charities is closing down their entire resettlement program on March 14th. The International Institute, the other Erie agency engaged in refugee resettlement will also be closing down in the near future. This means that the refugee community in this city, which is home to approximately 4,000 refugee families, will no longer have the assistance of these 2 agencies to help them adapt to the many cultural changes they face. Kinship will be seeking guidance from the mosques and other cultural centers in Erie as to how we can help them help these families. We ask God to guide us as cannot give up our efforts to live out Matthew's gospel message to welcome the stranger, feed the hungry, and cloth the naked. We will keep you posted as to how God guides Kinship moving forward.

Easter Basket Collection

As Easter approaches this year, we will again be helping Community Shelter Services (CSS) by collecting Easter basket items for the homeless and at-risk children in their programs. The dead line for donations is April 13th. The following items are requested:


BRAVO to the Cast and Crew of the 72nd Annual Sacred Heart Spaghetti Dinner!

Every year as we enter the Lenten season, I find myself having to field questions about why we do not eat meat on Fridays during Lent. The most common answer as to why the Church does not allow meat on Fridays during Lent is because the Pope owns Long John Silvers. I find this to be tasteless and insulting. The pope wouldn't own something as cheap as Long John Silver, I believe that it is the Red Lobster that he owns. After all, a delicious lobster tail in drawn butter is more to the Pontiff's taste than hush puppy and a breaded mystery sea creature from the cheaper chains.


In all seriousness, do we believe in the idea of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent as a form of empty discipline that the Church establishes to increase the size of its list of rules and regulations? Who are our Lenten practices for? Do we do things like avoiding meat on Fridays or Lenten fasting because we were told we must, or do we believe there is something in this observation that could actually help us become closer to God? If we are doing these things just because someone said we must, and we're not getting anything out of it beyond that, one could reasonably ask whether they are worth doing. Lent was not invented so that Catholics could take another shot at their New Year's resolutions. The sacrifices that we are asked to make are not frivolous instructions.

Those who look upon Lenten fast and abstinence with disdain bring up the old joke of two men in hells asking each other what their crime was that landed them in hell. One man says, "I was a serial killer, what did you do? The other man responds, "I ate meat on Friday." There is more sadness in this so-called joke than there is humor because those who look at this joke as a way to discredit the Church's instruction on not eating meat on Friday during Lent, completely miss the point of being asked to make this sacrifice. Just eating meat on Friday will not send one to hell, it is the denial of the sacrifice that Jesus made on the Cross that may lead to condemnation. We MUST NOT look at abstaining from meat of Fridays during Lent as a silly rule made by men to control the faithful. It is to be looked upon as a way to draw closer to God and acknowledge the fact that our redemption has been won by the Blood of the Cross.

When it comes down to it, our purpose in Lent isn't to do things or not do things just because we must, but because they can offer some meaning and growth in our lives. Finding God in that Friday Fish Filet meal from McDonalds may not be your cup of tea, but then again it might be the perfect adventure to try this Lent.
