

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph BOL Parishes.

CATECHETICAL SUNDAY: Happy Catechetical Sunday! St. Anselm, a learned, medieval scholar, famously defined theology as: "Faith seeking understanding." How true it is that our minds – and our hearts – burn with a desire to know God. Sometimes, though, we allow the anxieties of life and the pleasures of this world to deaden our desire for the divine. Nonetheless, the desire to know God - and to know about him - exists in every human heart. Our youth Faith Formation year begins next Sunday, and we are so excited to welcome the children from our parish churches and from St. Peter Cathedral. Clint and Stacey Badowski have prepared a really great year of growing in God's love! Beyond the children, us adults too are encouraged to continue learning more about our awesome Catholic Church and the Savior who founded her. "Life-long faith formation" is a popular term, these days, and it is an accurate one. Every day of our life is a good day to learn more about God! Sadly, we went through a period of several decades in which the Church as a whole utterly failed to teach the fullness of the Catholic Faith with all of its beauty and challenge. These days, we can look back and admit that failure. We want to do better. I sincerely thank our deacons, catechists, OCIA team members, bible study leaders, small group coordinators and everyone else who plays a "catechetical" role in our parishes. May we always allow our faith to grow in understanding. May we always have that hunger for God!

THE QUESTION OF LIVESTREAMS: The Luddites were a group of 19th century English textile workers who opposed the use of new technologies, which they believed negatively impacted their industry and their jobs. Nowadays, we use the term Luddite in a derogatory manner to describe anyone who opposes new technology as a whole. I am not a Luddite, but I do believe that our misuse of contemporary devices, such as social media platforms and smart phones, can and do negatively impact our lives, our communities, and our Church. I know that some folks are unhappy that we are no longer livestreaming our Masses from Sacred Heart or St. Joseph BOL. Please allow me to share several of the reasons that I am opposed to doing so: (1) I personally do not like being filmed at the pulpit and at the altar. It's a distraction that I do not want, and one that I believe can affect the prayerful celebration of the Mass. (2) If I misspeak or misquote or inadequately make a sensitive point, I don't want those errors to be available on the internet and social media for all to see. (3) I believe that the use of livestreaming has led to misunderstandings about the necessity of being at Mass on Sunday. I believe that the availability of livestreams has made it too convenient for Catholics to skip the Sunday celebration. or homebound, countless video sources are already available for viewing. EWTN, in particular, televises their chapel Mass three times throughout the course of the day, and their music and preaching are both excellent. (5) I genuinely appreciate the attachment that folks have to their own parish or church, but when the argument is made that – "I want to see Mass from <a href="may parish" – I offer the counterargument that we belong to a much broader and larger Catholic community." Especially in this time of mergers and partnerships, I hold that it is healthy to occasionally step outside the sometimes-limiting confines of our own parish experience. (6) Finally, I also worry about broadcasting the images of minor children. Major news outlets regularly blur the faces of minors during their broadcasts, and our own Church protocols require us to have parental permission before using such images. Those are my reasons. I get that I'm in the minority when it comes to my opposition to livestreaming. I get that numerous parishes and priests have fully embraced it. I understand that some of you may think that my reasoning is full of baloney. Nonetheless, I'm standing by this decision. I humbly ask that you trust in my judgment in this regard and move forward. Thank you for your consideration.


