

+ April 20, 2025 Resurrection of the Lord

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

JESUS IS RISEN: In the years immediately after Christ's resurrection from the dead, Christians lived with a palpable sense of joy. When they met each other on the street, they would often share this exchange: "Jesus is risen! He is risen, indeed!" Today, Easter Sunday, we too share in the joy of the Risen Lord. Sin brought darkness and death to the human race. Christ's victory over the grave has bought us light and life. You and I share intimately in this victory. Jesus really did undergo the Paschal Mystery for me and for you. Rejoice! Exult! There is no need to be afraid. The grave has no power over those who are in Christ Jesus. Happy Easter! Jesus is risen indeed!

THANK YOU: I am so appreciative of the graced moments we spent together in church during this Holy Week and Easter Triduum. God is so good! Many of you made real sacrifices of time to be with us. Thank you. I am grateful. Thank you as well to the Parish Leadership Team, our parish staff, our musicians and vocalists, our sacristans, our servers and our readers, all of our liturgical ministers, Deacon Doug and the OCIA team, and everyone who contributed to planning and preparing for the beautiful liturgies we have experienced. Baptizing and bringing into the Catholic Church our new members was a particularly satisfying experience. They say that the Church is ever young. These new Christians are proof of that aphorism. Blessings on them all! I say it again – God is good!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY: "This is the time of mercy!" St. Faustina Kowalska, the Apostle of Divine Mercy, is one of the "unofficial" patron saints of our parish family. In fact, on the right side of St. Joseph Church, she is prominently portrayed (along with her Polish contemporary, Pope St. John Paul II) in a large fresco. Faustina, in her mystical revelations, learned that Christ – even at the final moments of life – calls out our name. The Lord wants us to be saved! He wants us to be with him forever in heaven. I make it a practice to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet daily. In particular, I like to pray the Chaplet when I know that one of our parishioners is near death or has in fact died. God's mercy is powerful! Please join us at St. Joseph Bread of Life Community next Sunday, April 27 – Divine Mercy Sunday – as we recognize and thank God for his mercy. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will occur at 2:00 pm. I will be hearing confessions during the holy hour. At 3:00 pm, the Chaplet will be sung. Benediction will follow. Under the usual conditions, an indulgence is available for observing Divine Mercy Sunday.

FIFTY DAYS: Remember that the liturgical season of Easter lasts a full 50 days – all the way until Pentecost Sunday! Here in the Northern Hemisphere, the onset of spring coincides with our Easter celebration. Nature itself speaks of new life: trees are budding, flowers are blooming, temperatures are rising, and there is cause for new hope. Enjoy these days. Savor the beauty. Rejoice in the Lord. Allow the graces of Christ's presence to fill your hearts with peace. And as I like to say (mostly because of my own sweet tooth), don't feel bad for having an extra donut. The Church encourages us to celebrate!







Each one of us can play an important role in strengthening this culture of prevention. For example, we can better prevent abuse by ensuring that the signs of abuse are identified and reported. Noticing these warning signs, taking them seriously, and reporting them could prevent abuse in the future. When we witness inappropriate behavior or something that just doesn't seem quite right, we must report our concerns through the appropriate channels. 




PRAYER FOR OUR STUDENTS RECEIVING THEIR FIRST EUCHARIST

THE AGONY AND THE ECSTACY

Several years ago, there was a movie starring Charlton Heston called, "The Agony and the Ecstasy." It was about Michelangelo's struggle to paint the Sistine Chapel. The movie took you from the agony that Michelangelo experienced through the years in which he struggled to paint the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel, to the triumph and the ecstasy in the beauty of the finished work.

On Palm Sunday we set the stage for the agony and the ecstasy of Jesus' final days on earth. The door to Jerusalem was opened to Jesus and he rode in as a hero among his followers. This what they expected in a Messiah! A hero; riding in triumph. What they didn't expect was that soon everything would collapse around him, and he would finish his role as the Messiah on a Cross, slaughtered like a criminal.

There are times in our life when the Lord opens a door for us and it looks good, like Palm Sunday, but as we go through that door, it begins to look like Good Friday, and we want to desperately turn back. Well, so did Jesus! In the Agony in the Garden, he was not looking forward to his death on the Cross, but he accepted the Father's will. Although Jesus walked through the door of his passion, it did not end on Friday in agony but concluded on Sunday in ecstasy. All those who suffer in this world, all those who feel the agony of life's obstacles, must look to Jesus now and identify with His suffering, for He identifies with ours. None of us can become really involved in the passion of our lord unless we are willing to be more deeply involved in our world. Unless we allow ourselves to be moved by the sufferings of the hungry, the oppressed, and the powerless in the light of the Crucifixion, we will never understand the great love that God has for us in this salvific act.

For every human suffering, every human evil is focused on the one single event of the cross.

Don't let this week go by without thinking that. Don't let this holy week pass without remembering that each of us share in the agony of the Cross of Christ with the promise that one day, we too shall share in the ecstasy of His Resurrection.
