


April 6, 2025 5th Sunday of Lent

To my Family of Sacred Heart (St. Paul) and St. Joseph/BOL Parishes,

STILL THE ONE: When in his goodness, God chose the people of Israel to be a people peculiarly his own (see Exodus 19:5), and he led them out of Egypt - that place of slavery - God made a covenant with Israel. God's covenant commitment was this: that he would provide the people of Israel with land, security, fruitfulness, flocks, herds, ample provision and peace. For their part, Israel was responsible for one primary task: be faithful to God alone. Sadly, they failed repeatedly to uphold their covenant obligation. Despite the pleas of the prophets, despite punishment and exile, Israel continued to turn toward false gods. If only they had been faithful! But what about you and I? We, too, are asked by God to put him absolutely above all else in our life. "The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength (Dt 6:5-6)." Lent truly is a privileged time to strengthen are commitment to God. The season of Lent, its scriptures and its prayers, its devotions and its penances, moves us to turn away from sin and to give our hearts without measure to the God who created us. Prayer is the foundation. Fasting is closely linked to prayer. Self-denial expands our hearts. Almsgiving makes our love concrete. Easter is still two weeks off. Let's live this moment of Lent. Let's place God exactly where he belongs: #1 in our lives.

THE LIGHT IS ON: Wednesday, April 9, from 5:00 – 7:00 pm, many of the parishes in Erie County will be open for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. "The Light is On" initiative is an encouragement for every Catholic, young and old, to receive God's merciful forgiveness during this holy season of Lent. I've already gone to confession, myself, two or three times this Lent. I've also heard hundreds of confessions during these Lenten days. People are going and there seems to be a renewed appreciation of this beautiful sacrament. Thanks be to God! I've always believed that a strong indicator of a healthy parish is that the confessional lines are long. Maybe you are reading this and you are uncertain. Maybe you haven't been to confession for many years. Maybe you are carrying the guilt of serious sin. Please, do not be afraid or hesitant. Trust in the mercy of Jesus Christ. He is greater than any sin we have committed! April 9th is just a few days away. Pick a church. Walk into the confessional. Be cleansed of your sin and guilt!

THE DAYS OF OUR SALVATION DRAW NEAR: I am begging. Again! Please be with us for the holiest days of the year, the days of the Easter Triduum. Parents, bring your young ones (even your crying babies or your sassy teens). Spouses, wrangle up your "but why should I go to church when it isn't even Sunday" husband or wife. Invite a friend. Provide a ride for an elderly parishioner. Bribe your curmudgeonly Catholic neighbor with a promise of post-Mass ice cream. Whatever it takes to get folks in the pews! I promise that God will bless you for your presence on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the celebration of our Lord's resurrection. And we, your parish family - we will be blessed by your presence as well. Thank you!

Deacon Dabblings

ARE YOU SERIOUS?

I have breaking news: Bishop Persico asked me and Fr. Steve to go to Rome and meet with the Curia to establish a set of guidelines for new priests and deacons who are assigned to parishes where the congregation speaks a language other than our native language. With the shortage of clergy, many of us may be asked to serve in foreign countries and to be successful, we must learn and follow the language and customs of that country. 
